Joh. Bapt. SCHAFFER Classic Riesling

100% Riesling

From the young gun winemaker

Sebastian Schaffer weaving his magic in the Nahe Valley near the Rheingau in Germany, this wine shows ripe white peach on the nose, crisp fruit flavors of green apples and ripe tangerines, with a nice minerality and long persistent dry finish. This is a beautifully crisp, refreshing white that will brighten the flavor of Asian seafood dishes. It also goes nicely with the fresh herbal flavors of delicate steamed or poached dishes.

Castello di Gabbiano Rose

100% Sangiovese

From the Castello di Gabbiano estate in the Chianti Classico region of Tuscany, this wine is ruby blush in color, with a lifted fragrant nose of light cherries and subtle spice. The palate shows juicy red berry fruits. Served nice and chilled, this wine is perfect for a pre-dinner drink by the pool or to accompany lunch with friends. It has a long, dry finish and goes superbly with antipasto or Asian dishes like char siew, hokkien fried noodles and barbequed pork ribs.

Castello di Gabbiano Alleanza IGT

75% Merlot 15% Sangiovese

10% Cabernet Sauvignon

This refined Supertuscan from winemaker Justin Bubb is powerful yet elegant, with a subtle nose of dark berry fruit and spice. This is a wine with a wonderful structure and finish. Castello di Gabbiano Bellezza IGT

100% Sangiovese

This sexy Supertuscan from winemaker Justin Bubb has a lifted nose of dark cherry fruit and integrated vanilla oak. Full of soulful sangiovese character, this wine offers a multi-layered journey for the palate. Vibrant berry fruit and notes of chocolate and spice show on the palate, with fine and edgy tannins and a full dry finish.

Le Fonti Chianti Classico Riserva DOCG

90% Sangiovese

10% Merlot

Deep ruby red in colour, this rich Riserva's bouquet is lifted and perfumed with notes of violet, ripe cherry and spice. The palate is harmonious and elegant, with an intense core of blackberry and marzipan, combined with a long fine acid backbone giving wonderful length. Le Fonti IGT Rosso Fontissimo

60% Sangiovese

40% Cabernet Sauvignon

This Supertuscan was born out of Le Fonti's passion for oak structured and fruity wines. 'Papa's Best', as the family calls it, is matured for up to 20 months in new French oak. Dark purple in colour, with blackberries and currants on the nose, with a hint of vanilla, black cherry and chocolate. This palate shows juicy, ripe black fruit flavours with a creamy finish. It is ideal served with meats, pasta and cheese.

**Brezza Barbera d'Alba Cannubi
Muscatel DOC**

One of the famous varieties of Piemonte, Barbera produces fruity, full-flavoured wines which can be very elegant. Brezza's Barbera is deep, rich and layered, opening slowly to flavors of bitter chocolate and spices, raisins, licorice and dried herbs. It is a great food wine, fantastic with a casual barbecue...but its elegance and depth means it is perfectly convincing as complex, formal red as well. This will drink well over the next 3 years.

Brezza Nebbiolo d'Alba Santa Rosalia DOC

Nebbiolo is the most famous grape variety in Piemonte. This Nebbiolo d'Alba is grown in Brezza's Santa Rosalia vineyard, located just outside the town of Alba. With a medium body, this wine exhibits fruity aromas of peach and wild berries. Its freshness and elegance means it pairs well with antipasto or light pasta dishes. It is best enjoyed young, but will further develop with a brief cellaring. **'Classic Nebbiolo roses and tar – Sensational buy' – Lisa Perotti-Brown MW, Singapore.**

Brezza Barolo Cannubi DOCG

From one of the most historic crus in Barolo, the 'Cannubi' Barolo shows great concentration and personality, with elements of sweet and spice, liquorice, anise and black fruits. The palate is full bodied and expansive, with silky yet chewy tannins and a solid core of dark berried fruits. This Barolo is quite approachable now, but will reward careful cellaring. A wine of 'graceful elegance that is the hallmark of this vintage' **89 points – Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate.**

Brezza Barolo Sarmassa DOCG

Winner of the prestigious 3 bicchiere (3 glasses) from Gambero Rosso (Italy's premier wine guide), this is a grand Barolo with a wealth of flavor and aromatics that will keep you intrigued! Produced from the Sarmassa vineyard, which is a renowned crus in the Barolo region of Piemonte, this is a rich wine which offers a long, subtle and mysterious journey for the palate, generous but soft tannins, deep plum flavours and notes of dried spices and fennel.

Brezza Barolo Sarmassa DOCG

The 2004 vintage from the renowned Sarmassa vineyard shows rich dark cherry and plum notes on the nose, with a seductive hint of dried roses and herbs. The palate is fleshy and full, with dark plum and cherry flavours dominant and some complex notes of fennel and anise. Winner of the prestigious 3 bicchiere from Gambero Rosso for an amazing third successive year, this is a truly elegant and seductive wine. **91 points Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate.**

Brezza Barolo DOCG

Among the different examples of Barolo produced by the Brezza estate, this wine is perfect for the wine lover who wants to experience the complex and fascinating world of Barolos for the first time. This is a medium-bodied Barolo which is showing some nice development and is drinking well now. It has an intriguing bouquet of dried flowers and herbs, leading into a subtle, elegant palate of bitter chocolate and plums. It will pair well with soups, braised beef dishes and mild cheeses.

IL Borghetto 'Bilaccio' Chianti Classico Riserva
100% Sangiovese

This powerful and elegant wine is produced from a selection of some of the finest sangiovese from the estate, from one of the all-time great vintages. The 2006 Bilaccio speaks of its Tuscan origins with a beautiful purity and elegance. The bouquet shows black fruits, leather and tobacco. The palate is rich and dense with an elegant mouth-feel comparable to Pinot Noir. It displays a dark core of liquorice and blackberry flavours.

IL Borghetto Chianti Classico Riserva
100% Sangiovese

Using the very best sangiovese from the estate, this Riserva from winemaker Tim Manning has impeccable structure and character and is rich with the flavours of Tuscany. Aromas of blackberry, dark cherries, spice and strawberry follow through to a full-bodied fleshy palate of dark fruits, leather and spice. Matured for 30 months in old and new French oak and further aged for 12 months in bottle before release.
